he enclosed condensed financial report clearly shows that in 2013, Ronald McDonald House of Newfoundland and Labrador Inc. ("RMHNL") enjoyed an extremely successful year from a financial perspective. This financial success is a demonstration of the continuing generosity and support that our charity has received, throughout its successful capital campaign and now in its first full year of operations, from literally thousands of donors including individuals, community groups, service organizations, businesses, charities and government. RMHNL has received widespread support from across Newfoundland and Labrador, the rest of Canada and even from international donors. Through financial contributions; in-kind contributions of goods and services; participation in a wide variety of fundraising events; and countless volunteer hours, the community has embraced our charity and the families that it serves.

The most significant financial milestone of the current year was the repayment, in full, of the bridge financing that had been arranged to construct the House. At the end of 2013, RMHNL has net assets of \$5,577,000 invested in its physical facility and a net asset position of slightly more than \$1 million in its General Fund.

This financial position will allow RMHNL to maintain the facility and continue to provide excellent services and support to the

families that need a home-away-from-home. The Board has committed to designate funds over the coming years towards a Property Replacement Reserve, in accordance with a Reserve Study Report completed during the year. This Replacement Reserve will ensure that RMHNL accumulates adequate funds to provide for proactive maintenance and replacement of key components of its facility over its expected lifespan. The current financial position will afford our charity the flexibility to meet this commitment while at the same time maintaining and expanding the services provided to our families.

It is a distinct pleasure to serve as Treasurer of this organization with the support of an active Board of Directors; continuing support and guidance from Ronald McDonald Children's Charities of Canada, a dedicated team of management and staff, the hundreds of volunteers that so willingly give of their time and talents, and the thousands of donors that support Our House throughout the year. The commitment of each of these groups to fulfilling the mission of the organization is truly inspiring.

The financial information provided in this annual report is in a condensed format; however complete audited financial statements of the organization are available on request, at the charity office.
