Iron Ore Company of Canada Adopt a Room at Ronald McDonald House Charities Newfoundland and Labrador

(October 24, 2018, St. John's, NL) – Iron Ore Company of Canada (IOC) announced the adoption of a Family Suite on Monday October 22, 2018 at Ronald McDonald House Charities Newfoundland and Labrador (RMHC NL). Adopting a room at RMHC NL provides individuals, organizations and corporations with the opportunity to provide the most caring and practical support to families during an incredibly stressful time. When families find themselves traveling far from home so their child can receive medical care in St. John's, having the programs and services at RMHC NL provides a sense of security to parents who know they will be able to stay close to their sick or injured child.

The Adopt-a-Room program ensures that common areas and family suites at RMHC NL are beautifully kept, and maintained. Following the announcement today, representatives presented Ronald McDonald House with a cheque for the first payment towards the \$15,000, three-year commitment. Representatives also enjoyed a guided tour of the house as well as a visit with the family currently staying in their adopted suite, The Andrews Family of Creston.

Logan is currently hospitalized, so for the past 52 nights the family have stayed together and close to their son at Ronald McDonald House. For the Andrews family, with a toddler and new born twins, with one hospitalized and in need advanced medical care in St. John's some 307km from their home, Ronald McDonald House has now become their home when they cannot be at home.

"IOC is very proud of our continued commitment to the Ronald McDonald House NL, it's an organization that is near and dear to the hearts of our employees as well as the residents in our communities," says Heather Bruce-Veitch, Director of Communications and External Relations. "Living in Labrador West, we have many families who have benefited from the comforts of the Ronald McDonald House in St. John's. When families have to travel for medical reasons, having a place that feels like home can make this stressful time in their lives a little bit easier. We are so pleased to be able to support our employees, our communities, and such a worthwhile organization."

Since opening in 2012, Ronald McDonald House Newfoundland and Labrador has provided more than 29,000 nights of comfort and care to more than 1288 families, saving families with a sick or injured child an estimated \$4.9M!

Open 24 hours a day/7 days a week, Ronald McDonald House features many common areas including a large kitchen, family room, television room, resource center, home office, children's play areas and laundry facilities. The House is open

to parents, siblings and at times, extended family members of children receiving medical treatment in St. John's. It draws on a pool of committed volunteers who help families feel at home.
