### Ronald McDonald House rolls out the Red Carpet to recognize Volunteers

(April 15, 2019, St. John's, NL) – Ronald McDonald House Charities Newfoundland and Labrador (RMHC NL) relies heavily on the work of volunteers to fulfill their mission. On April 12 & 13, 2019, Ronald McDonald House recognized the hundreds of volunteers that give so much of their time in the house and in the community at a special event in St. John's titled "Strength in Numbers" Volunteering Gathering, appropriately themed "Team Work." This event was recognized with an International Award for best practice by RMHC in 2015 and includes training, awards, fun team building, recognition, a guided tour of Ronald McDonald House and guest speakers, which included Kate Horton, Executive Director RMHC Canada, Dr. Lynette Bowes, Pediatric Oncologist Janeway Children's Hospital, and a RMHC Family, Selina & Sheldon Carroll & four-year old son Michael of Labrador City along with Michael's grandparents Myles & Daphne Parsons, frequent guests of Ronald McDonald House since 2015. Since Michael was born in 2015, he and his family have stayed at Ronald McDonald House on 15 occasions totalling 409 nights.

At the conclusion of the event, volunteers were recognized for their years of commitment, which included recognizing two founding Board Members with 10 years of service, **Theresa Rahal**, RMHC Board Chairperson and **Bill Budgell**, retiring Board Treasurer.

Ronald McDonald House Charities Newfoundland and Labrador is grateful to the time and energy that **Dr. Jack Hand** gave to making Ronald McDonald House a reality in this province. Now that the House is opened, with many active and dedicated volunteers, the charity has implemented the **Helping** "HAND" Awards in honor of the late **Dr. Jack Hand**. These awards were proudly presented by his wife, **Tina Hand and daughters Amy & Jesse Hand along with a surprise appearance by his son Michael Hand**, who are all volunteers with Ronald McDonald House.

These young boys and girls do not let their age discourage them from making a difference in the lives of sick children and their families. For the past 7 birthdays this individual has asked for a very special birthday present from this friends and family, he asks for money, not for the latest video game or toys, but to donate that money. In addition, to money from his birthdays, he has found other creative ways to be able to make a difference including a book, at age 8, titled *Not Too Small to Help* the proceeds went to charities, in his community, including Ronald

McDonald House. As well, there is money from chores, and not just your ordinary type of chores. In 2018, he washed dishes at an event for over four hours, and then he donated the \$500 he earned to RMHC. His most recent contribution in 2019 was an \$800.00 donation from selling wooden ornaments he created. His donations total over \$4,000 to Ronald McDonald House. His generosity also extends to other charities including organizations that provide clean drinking water. His mother was not surprised that he wanted to donate all his money to charities. When he was three, at Christmas, he would wrap food and drinks from their pantry to give to the boys and girls that needed it. This Young Hero truly reflects philanthropy and Dr. Jack Hand's passion and commitment to helping sick children and their families.
