Meet Young Hero and Winner of the 2019 RMHC Helping Hand Award



For the past 7 birthdays Gabe Flynn of Labrador City has asked for a very special birthday present from his friends and family, he asks for money, not for the latest video game or toys, but to donate. In addition to money from his birthdays he has found other creative ways to be able to make a difference including writing a book at age 8, titled Not Too Small to Help. The proceeds went to charities in his community, including Ronald McDonald House. He would also donate money from chores, and not just your ordinary type of chores. In 2018, he washed dishes at an event for over four hours, and then donated the \$500 he earned to RMHC. His most recent contribution in 2019 was an \$800.00 donation from selling wooden ornaments he created. His donations total over \$4,000 to Ronald McDonald House. His generosity also extends to other charities including organizations that provide clean drinking water. His mother was not surprised that he wanted to donate all his money to charities. When he was three, at Christmas, he would wrap food and drinks from their pantry to give to the boys and girls that needed it. This Young Hero truly reflects philanthropy, compassion and commitment to helping sick children and their families.

2020 Red Shoe Crew-Walk for Families -Your Walk, Your Way!



With an online fundraising page to support your efforts, kids can collect donations easily, funds are sent straight to Ronald McDonald House Charities Newfoundland and Labrador and supporters receive an instant tax receipt.

- 1. **Visit rmhc.ca** Click on "Create Your Fundraiser", make an account and sign in
- 2. Fill out the four sections:

Step 1: Fundraiser Details: Your Fundraiser name, your goal, fundraiser description, whether or not you are hosting an event. Designate RMHC NL and fundraiser end date

Step 2: Upload an eye-catching image or video to your campaign. Perhaps a photo of why you are fundraising or what you are doing.

Step 3: If you are not hosting an event this step will automatically be skipped, if you are hosting an event then put all the event details such as date and location here

Step 4: Review. Make sure all the information is correct and that everything looks good. You are ready to publish your fundraiser and start raising funds!

Once your fundraiser is live, start sharing it around and raise as much as you can!

Fundraising Ideas

- Host a change drive. Spare change can make great change.
 Grab an empty jar and set a goal to fill it with spare change. You
 can ask their grandparents, neighbors, dance teacher, or others to
 contribute their spare change in support of a great cause. Want to
 up the ante? Ask local businesses to participate by starting their
 own change drive and watch how quickly it all adds up!
- Host a pizza party. Whether it's at school or as part of a community group, arrange a pizza party and sell slices to students to raise funds for a great cause. A local pizza shop may even be willing to donate the pizza to show their support. It's a delicious way to give back!
- Host a cupcake, cookie bake sale. Whip up a batch of cupcakes or cookies (or ask your parents or grandparents to bake) and have fun selling them in your neighborhood.
- Shocking Haircut. Have long locks ready to be chopped?
 Organize a hair cutting event for kids to get their long locks lopped or completely shaved off if their family and friends pledge to make a donation. Plus, once the locks have been chopped, the haircut or shave can be recorded and posted online so everyone will get to see the results of their donation to RMHC!
- Organize a talent show! Give kids a chance to showcase their talent while raising funds for RMHC Whether it's in the school gym, your local community centre, or even your own backyard, kids can sing, dance, and tell jokes all for a good cause. Sell tickets to friends and family, and kids will love the opportunity to put on a show and support a great cause.
- Costume Party! It doesn't need to be Halloween to wear a fun costume. When you organize a costume day, you and your friends or classmates can dress up as your favorite costume in exchange for a small donation.
- Host a dog wash. Invite all the neighborhood dogs over for a
 bath and a treat! Your kids and their friends can charge a fee per
 dog, and give them a bath while having fun with their furry friends.
 Plan for a warm sunny day, and put up posters and use social
 media to advertise. Everyone will have fund, even the dogs. You
 could also consider a community car wash

Fundraising Ideas

- Go on a scavenger hunt. A great team fundraising idea is to get kids to team up and pay a fee to participate in a scavenger hunt in. Younger children can look for ordinary objects like an unsharpened pencil or a specific book, while older kids can be given puzzles or brain teasers to complete while they are on the hunt. A scavenger hunt can help kids develop problem solving skills, so everyone wins!
- Get crafty and host a sale. Whether it is beaded necklaces, ornaments, or painted rocks for the garden. Kids can assemble crafts during school time or at home, and invite the community to attend the sale in the evening or on a weekend to ensure a big turnout. Your kids will feel good knowing that their hard work is helping keep families close at RMHC.
- Set up a refreshing drink stand, lemonade or ice cream stand!
 Sometimes a good old-fashioned lemonade stand is the easiest way to fundraise! Set up shop with your treats on the front lawn, and you and your friends can sell drinks or ice cream to people in the neighborhood.
- Lend a helping hand. Do you have neighbors who need help shoveling the driveway or raking leaves? How about getting your kids to help out their neighbors AND raise money for RMHC! Create flyers to hand out and be sure to mention that they are supporting a good cause. Kids can choose to donate all the proceeds or keep a small percentage as a reward, but either way everyone will benefit.
- Garage Sale .Most kids have lots of great toys they don't play
 with anymore. Your parents and neighbors also have great items
 they don't use. Collect items and hold the sale in your driveway,
 your local park or community center, Sell the items and make a donation to RMHC.
- Wake-A-Thon at school. Imagine how much fun it would be to hang out with your friends, watch movies, and have a sleepover, all while at school!? A school sleepover is a great fundraising idea that allows kids to bring their pillow and sleeping bag to spend the night on the gym floor making memories that will last all school year. A group of parent and teacher volunteers are essential for this idea, and students can be asked to give a small donation to attend. Plus, the evening could include a popcorn or bake sale table so kids can purchase their movie snacks, and a pancake breakfast can be held in the morning before all the parents comie to pick up their children. No one will want to miss out on this event, and RMHC will be the one who benefits the most.
- Organize a Recycling Drive and/or Collect Pull Tabs. Collect recyclable items from your family, friends and neighbors and turn it into cash for RMHC. You can also collect the pull tabs off cans. These are also recycled for cash. Recycling can be dropped off directly to a recycling location.
- Be a Birthday Hero: this year why not be a RMHC birthday hero and ask your friends and family to donate to RMHC in honour of your birthday.
