Family is medicine, and right now it's helping 12-year-old Connor Butt of Stephenville fight cancer at Ronald McDonald House

It is difficult to put into words how a parent feels when their child has been diagnosed with a serious illness. It has to be one of the most challenging experiences for a family. For families who do not live close to the medical care and resources they need, there is the added stress of distance. RMHC gives families with a sick child what they need most – each other.



In January 2021, Connor Butt, eleven at the time, was experiencing pain on the left side of his back and was treated for a kidney infection. In May, the pain returned this time with a fever. His parents, Nadine and Chris, were pretty concerned. It was the day following Mother's Day, that an ultrasound discovered a tumor, later diagnosed as

Wilms Tumor. Also known as **nephroblastoma**, Wilms Tumor can affect both kidneys, but usually develops in just one. Treatment usually involves **surgery and chemotherapy**, **and sometimes radiation therapy**. To get the medical care Connor needs, means relocating from their home, family and friends in Stephenville to St. John's nearly 800km away.

For the Butt Family, Nadine, Chris, Connor and his older sister Hope, this was going to be a challenging road ahead in a city far from home. This is something no family could prepare for. They worried about numerous things, even the simple things, like where they would stay. Shortly after the Butt Family arrived in St. John's, they were introduced to the programs and services of Ronald McDonald House.

"We initially heard of RMHC on TV and with the fire department where Chris works. They have volunteered as a group for McHappy Day in our hometown at McDonald's in Stephenville. We also heard about Ronald McDonald previously as we have friends that stayed there before. When we found out we could stay there it was such a relief." – Nadine Butt

One of the biggest advantages for families staying at Ronald McDonald House is being so close to the hospital. Nothing is as frightening for a parent or for a child as hospitalization. Ronald McDonald House is just steps away from our province's children's hospital which means that Nadine and Chris could take turns staying with Connor overnight while he was admitted in the hospital. Taking care of a sick child is one of the most draining and difficult tasks a parent can face. Beyond handling physical challenges and medical needs, parents also have to deal with their child's emotional

needs and the impact that a prolonged illness can have on the entire family. Luckily, this tough balancing act doesn't have to be done alone. Families find support with other families staying at Ronald McDonald House.



"When Connor's twoweek visit became an eight week stay, Ronald McDonald House became a second home for our family, and its spaghetti-making, birthday cake-baking staff and volunteers

became our family who went above and beyond to make a this situation not just bearable, but even enjoyable."

Nadine added, "You truly don't understand the value of RMHC until you stay there. Honestly, it's a place that you don't actually want to go to but it's the most comforting place that I can ever think of being during a situation like this. Interacting with other families in similar circumstances is very helpful. At the beginning of our stay I wasn't up to interacting with anyone and became closed off but once I opened up and spoke with another mom of a sick child it was so comforting. We became friends and could help support each other. As family is medicine, so are friends, especially ones who know what you're going through. Interacting with the other families, volunteers and staff is something we look forward to. We are very social people and seeing the same friendly faces on a daily basis became part of our healing and we take comfort in knowing that our RMHC Family is there for us."

While Connor's journey is far from over, with treatments expected to continue into 2022, the Butt Family have found strength together at Ronald McDonald House and have come to rely on the vital programs and services offered.

Connor relapsed in the summer of 2022 and needed the support of Ronald McDonald House into the spring 2023 for a second round of treatments. In total the Butt Family have spent a total of 217 nights at Ronald McDonald House.

In 2022, we had the privilege of providing family centered programs and services to **174 children** supported by **304 caregivers** who traveled to St. John's for medical reasons for their child.

This broad base of support has enabled us to provide unwavering comfort and care to families and for that we say **thank you**.

Our province is quite large and our families travel long distances to receive the medical attention and resources they need for their children at the province's pediatric hospital.

We worked diligently throughout the pandemic to remain safely open every day to provide families with comfort, care, and a network of support at Ronald McDonald House. In the spring of 2022, we were so excited to welcomed back groups and many new volunteers to help deliver our programs. We are so grateful.

In a year that was still far from normal, we were able to provide familiar comforts from home and stability when it mattered most. Families made home-cooked meals in the kitchen and did laundry. Watched their children blow out the candles on their birthday cakes. They let their creativity shine while carving pumpkins and decorating gingerbread houses. Countless friendships were formed and strengthened. It wouldn't be possible without our strong network of support.

We express our heartfelt appreciation to all the Red Shoe Crew volunteers, supporters, event volunteers and community volunteers who have been working tirelessly to adapt to a changing fundraising environment to help raise funds for Ronald McDonald House. With additional challenges faced by everyone this year, their collective commitment to our mission does not go unnoticed. The success of the Red Shoe Crew-Walk for Families in September was outstanding! The campaign raised an outstanding \$226,737 and our signature events raised record amounts to support our programs and services. We deeply appreciate all the time and effort volunteers, sponsors and participants put in to helping ensure our mission is funded. We were all thrilled to see our volunteers again with the reinstatement of the annual

Strength in Numbers Volunteer Conference in April.

We are also very excited, and grateful to our friends at McDonald's. We are grateful to McDonald's leadership, customers and the owner-operators in Newfoundland and Labrador and across the country, for recognizing the need at RMHC, and for continuing to support our mission and families with such commitment. McHappy Day was a huge success that raised funds for RMHC even in our fluid and uncertain COVID-19 reality.

2022 also marked the 10th anniversary of RMHC in Newfoundland and Labrador. Based on feedback from our families and studies to support families, we announced the Family Time Park capital campaign to redesign our outdoor space.

Making the dream of quality outdoor space for sick or injured children and their families a reality depended on the generosity and kindness of others. The campaign goal was \$850,000 dollars in funding to cover the costs of the development and construction of the outdoor space, landscaping, and accessible play areas.

Though ambitious, with the support of the community we successfully broke ground in July 2022 and started construction. We later reached the full financial goal with many generous donors and look forward to officially opening the Family Time Park in the spring of next year.

Looking forward to 2023 one thing we do know for sure, is that families with a sick or injured child need our care and support. Every day we continue to receive requests from families needing our programs and services and we are determined to be there for the children and families of Newfoundland and Labrador.

As an organization we remain focused on providing a safe environment to keep families close to each other and the medical care and resources they need. With your ongoing support, will we continue to play a major role in the lives of sick children and their families.

This 2022 Annual Report is our opportunity to express our gratitude for your generosity. It is a chance for you to read about your impact on hundreds of children and families. We are making a difference in the lives of sick children. We are creating a community of support that extends across Newfoundland and Labrador, with 8 family-centered programs, over 300 volunteers and 15 RMHC staff. We hold high the trust you have in us as we stand together in service to the families of sick or injured children. Compassion is at the heart of RMHC and we thank you for embracing our mission. Your generosity means that more families have more time to focus on what matters most: their children.

FAMILY SUPPORT PROGRAMS











HOME FOR DINNER PROGRAM – With the help of individuals, corporate and community groups, we offer families the ability to return from a long stressful day at the hospital to a home-cooked meal 4-5 times each week. Groups plan the menu and prepare the meal in our fully equipped kitchen.

JUST LIKE NAN'S BAKED GOODS PROGRAM – Nothing feels like home more than the smell of fresh baked goods. Individuals, corporate and community groups bake on-site to ensure Ronald McDonald House is always stocked with special treats or Breakfast-to-Go items fresh from the oven, just like at Nan's house.

WARM WELCOME PROGRAM – Our Families Services team provide a warm welcome for all the families that come through our doors. During the check in process families are provided with RMHC information, a guided tour and ongoing support during their entire stay. As part of the Warm Welcome process, our families will receive a Warm Welcome Bag. Each branded welcome bag, compliments of our friends with Thirty-One Gifts, holds toiletries, information regarding the surrounding neighborhood, a personal medical journal, a home-made quilt and an age-appropriate surprise for each child. Providing a warm welcome goes a long way in helping a family feel at home, so they can focus on what matters most, healing their sick or injured child.


KEEPING FAMILIES CONNECTED PROGRAM – Being away from loved ones for an extended period of time can be very difficult and create added stress. To help keep families connected to home while staying at Ronald McDonald House, families will have access to a Home Office, wireless Internet, computers/tablets, email, and long distance calling & community newspapers. Families can also access special flights through a partnerships RMHC NL has with **WestJet Cares Program and PAL Airlines**.

MAGIC ROOM – The Magic Room is a very special place the children staying at Ronald McDonald House get to visit at least once during every stay, primarily at check out. The Magic Room also provides a special surprise for when they have a successful surgery, are celebrating a special event or even if they had a rough day. The kids get to enter the Magic Room and leave with a brand new gift and a very **big smile!**

SPECIAL DAY CELEBRATIONS PROGRAM – Just like home, preparations are made to ensure, birthdays are celebrated, everyone gets treats at Hallowe'en and visitors like Santa Claus and the Easter Bunny arrive on schedule. There are many celebrations scheduled throughout the year.

HOUSE PANTRY PROGRAM – Not every family arrives at Ronald McDonald House for a scheduled medical appointment or treatment, often it can be because of medical emergency. Helping families adjust to life in another city, far from home with a sick child, the House Pantry Program provides a variety of staple items, including milk, eggs, butter, bread, etc along with non-perishable food items such as canned foods, baking supplies, cereals, and pastas as well as a variety of toiletries items, laundry and cleaning supplies. Together, with the help of generous donors families have access to a fully stocked House Pantry, House refrigerator and House freezer which are available to families while staying at Ronald McDonald House.

RECREATION PROGRAM – Ronald McDonald House has its own resource center fully stocked with books, craft supplies and games. It also has children's play areas, including the Family Time Theatre to enjoy video game play and movies. Ronald McDonald House will open its own outdoor playground called **Family Time Park** for children and families to play and enjoy quality family time in the spring of 2023. Ronald McDonald House is also conveniently located next to The Grand Concourse; an integrated walkway system, Our families also benefit from time to time with donations to Ronald McDonald House of tickets or passes to local sporting events, fitness centers, movies, special events or concerts.

This new space will give sick or injured children a safe and accessible space to play and enjoy much needed outdoor family time.

"September 2022 will mark the 10th anniversary of RMHC in Newfoundland and Labrador. In that time a lot has been accomplished, but there is still more work to be done. It's now the perfect time! Time for more mission, more family support and more quality family time. It's time for Family Time Park" said RMHC NL Board Chair Theresa Rahal. "Providing a fun, accessible and secure space for our families to interact in a park setting, will help us enhance the experience for all sick or injured children and their families that need the Ronald McDonald House."

"While \$850,000 is an ambitious goal, it becomes attainable when you consider the generosity and confidence shown by our early donors," said Gerry Beresford, volunteer with the Campaign Working Group. "We are thrilled to break ground on the Family Time Park today. This safe, accessible and fun outdoor space will be sure to have a positive impact for families at Ronald McDonald House."


The project will see the development of an accessible and fenced outdoor area surrounding the Ronald McDonald House with improvements such as fencing, entrance gate, bbq/patio area, and most importantly a children's playground with rubber play surface, two bay accessible swing set, and nature-based play features.

"The plan is to upgrade the land in front of the building between the front and woods area that is beyond it. There is a new pavilion going to be there, a great place where families will be able to have barbeques or picnics. There will be a court there to shoot basketballs and score hockey goals. Everything we do with this park will have accessibility and safety at the forefront. The project has been awarded to Modern Paving and is expected to be completed in Spring 2023." said John Poole, volunteer on the RMHC NL Facilities Committee.

Ashley Renouf of Cape St. George has stayed at Ronald McDonald House when her son Ryder is fighting leukemia. "My kids love being outside. Prior to Ryders diagnosis we were a very active outdoors family. So being able to have a space for the kids to burn their energy will be amazing. They have also made some friends and even had a soccer game or two with some other families! It gives the kids time to unwind and just be kids, to let them forget about everything else going on. The Family Time Park will be a great distraction for everyone. Children love to play, even with health limitations. Being able to accommodate those limitations still gives children and families that sense of normalcy while still letting them explore and just be a kid! It brings families together during stressful times. Even on Ryders worst days, he enjoys going outside to the RMHC playground for some fun!"

Nature and the outdoors have always been associated with positive energy, wellness and a place to enhance overall mental health. Spending time and being physically active in nature has been proven to promote a healthy lifestyle and improve overall wellbeing. Spending time outside helps us recover from the effects of stress and our everyday worries. ADOPT-A-ROOM PROGRAM



THE ADOPT-A-ROOM PROGRAM is an opportunity for individuals to help families who are going through the most traumatic event in their lives – an illness or injury of their child – by adopting a room in the House.

The Adopt-a-Room Program ensures that the rooms at Ronald McDonald House are beautifully kept, operated and maintained for families who need a comfortable place to stay in St. John's while seeking medical attention for their child. Adoption of a room for one or three years helps cover the costs associated with maintenance and upkeep of the room, ensuring it is always available for the families that stay with us each night. This program supports hundreds of families each year, making sure rooms will always have necessities like comfort, clean linens and repairs. Rooms require updating at times and this support helps make that happen.

Recognition of support is placed on the bedroom door of one of the common areas in Ronald McDonald House as well as in printed pieces and media channels.



MESSAGE FROM TREASURER FISCAL YEAR 2022

This message marks the end of my fourth year as Treasurer for the Ronald McDonald House of Newfoundland and Labrador Inc. ("RMHC NL"). I want to take this important opportunity to thank our management, staff, and volunteers who make the House and our important programs truly exceptional. I would also like to thank our generous donors for their continued support of the success of Ronald McDonald House of Newfoundland and Labrador. I know I say this every year but I'm just continually in awe of all the great things we accomplish together. I'm grateful for you all and honoured to be able to continue to give back to our communities during this time. As I continue my volunteer journey with this charity, I still find myself moved by the heart-warming stories from families who have stayed at the house.

I'm pleased to report that RMHC NL was fortunate enough to be able to continue to count on the generosity and support of thousands of our donors. Individuals, community groups, service organizations, labour organizations, businesses, other charities and government have all found ways to support our mission and to focus on providing our families with the best possible support despite the many hurdles everyone faced in 2022. This support takes the form of financial contributions, in-kind contributions of goods and services, participation in a wide variety of fundraising events and countless volunteer hours. We certainly are very grateful to have maintained this level of support in 2022.

At the end of 2022, RMHC NL has combined net assets of approximately \$8,772,971. This includes the balance invested in capital assets of approximately \$5,218,093; an operating fund reserve of \$2,300,000; and unrestricted net assets of approximately

\$1,254,878. The Charity has a strong cash and short-term investments position of approximately \$3.78M at the end of the year.

The Charity had excess of revenue over expenditures for 2022 of approximately \$544,792. Total revenue and other support for the year increased by \$401,838 year over year to approximately \$2,136,010 for the year. Revenue and expenditures included donated goods and services of approximately \$291,704 for 2022 as compared to approximately \$216,720 in 2021.

In terms of expenditures, the cash cost of operating the charity (excluding donated goods and services and amortization of capital assets) is approximately \$1,129,302 which changed by approximately \$129,424 during the year, representing a 12.9% increase. This increase is a result of a combination of factors including inflationary pressures, labour market changes, and general operating year over year changes. The financial information provided in this annual report is in a condensed format; however complete audited financial statements of the organization are available on request at the charity office
