Ronald McDonald House offers accommodations, programs and services to sick or injured children and their families who must travel to St. John's for medical reasons. Operated by a small staff and supported by dedicated volunteers, we now seek the services of a temporary Development Assistant.

This position is unique - a job with real meaning and sense of purpose. If you are an enthusiastic individual seeking a position where you can make a difference every day, this position is for you. Reporting to the Director of Development & Communications, the Development Assistant's key responsibilities include:

- Signature event support;
- Third Party event support;
- Assistance with correspondence and donor acknowledgements;
- Data Entry;
- Administration

Required Knowledge, Skills, Abilities:

- Proficiency in MS Office would be considered an asset;
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills;
- Excellent interpersonal skills;
- Ability to multi-task and meet deadlines in a fast-paced environment;
- Experience working in an office environment would also be considered an asset;
- Successful record of working with volunteers considered an asset
- Experience volunteering or working with a with a Red Shoe Crew-Walk for Families or a similar event would be considered an asset;

The program provides wage subsidies to employers to create quality summer work experiences for young people aged 15 to 30 years.

To be eligible, applicants must:

- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment and
- have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations

Compensation: The position is a temporary Canada Summer Job Grant position. Canada Summer Job program grant details: 35 hours per week for a total of 280 hours \$16.00/hour – ideal start date is June 30, 2025 (start date is flexible).
